In both Philadelphia and Columbus, Ohio, we have helped transform urban blight into urban beauty. In Columbus, The Scotts Urban Garden Academy helps train community volunteers to use gardening to beautify neighborhoods in a way that curbs crime and instills a renewed sense of pride in the community.

In our hometown of Marysville, Ohio, we've made major long-term commitments to initiatives ranging from the YMCA to Union County Memorial Hospital.

And through our Miracle-Gro Kids Columbus program, we have adopted a classroom of third graders, providing them with educational, health, family and social support throughout their academic careers. We'll even make sure they have money to go to college.

SCOTTS' CORPORATE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT HAS ACHIEVED ISO 14001 CERTIFICATION, THE HIGHEST STANDARD BY WHICH COMPANIES ACROSS THE GLOBE ARE JUDGED FOR THEIR COMMITMENT TO ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTICES AND REGULATORY COMPLIANCE. ISSUES SUCH AS TECHNICAL CAPABILITIES, TRAINING, EXPERIENCE OF PERSONNEL, INTERNAL AUDITING PROCEDURES, REGULATORY COMPLIANCE AND THE OPERATIONAL IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT WERE EVALUATED DURING THE PROCESS. IN ADDITION, THE COMPANY RECEIVED THE 2001 AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESPONSIBLE CARE FROM THE OHIO CHEMISTRY TECHNOLOGY COUNCIL.

B eing a steward of the environment is part of the fabric of The Scotts Company. It's more than a pledge... more than a promise to our shareholders and consumers. It's the right thing to do.

Our products play a key role in maintaining a healthy and beautiful environment. Lawn fertilizers help maintain thick, vigorous lawns that absorb rain, control runoff and cool the Earth. Control products help eradicate pests that destroy landscapes and carry disease. And garden fertilizers create fuller blooms and larger, healthier plants.

But our commitment to the environment goes far beyond the benefits provided by our products. It is evident in our actions.

Scotts is recognized as one of the leading recyclers in the United States. In both 2000 and 2001 our growing media business composted more than 2 million tons of natural waste material. Our European operation is also aggressively stepping up its recycling efforts in the next several years.

From the research lab to manufacturing to packaging to sales, Scotts is dedicated to improving the environment. Our Environmental Stewardship Team is made up of executives and managers from throughout the organization to ensure that our environmental commitment reaches every aspect of our business.

For example, to avoid unintended misuse of our products, we're incorporating child-resistant packaging in our line. Our research and development teams are EACH YEAR, SCOTTS' GROWING MEDIA DIVISION RECYCLES MORE THAN 2 MILLION TONS OF WASTE. BY-PRODUCTS, SUCH AS BARK, MANURE AND YARD WASTE, THAT WOULD OTHERWISE END UP IN LANDFILLS, ACCOUNT FOR ABOUT 70% OF THE RAW MATERIAL USED TO PRODUCE POTTING MIX, GARDEN AND LAWN SOILS, AS WELL AS MULCHES AND OTHER GROWING MEDIA PRODUCTS.




REFINING THE MANUFACTURING PROCESS

WHILE PRODUCTION HAS INCREASED MORE THAN 300 PERCENT AT OUR MARYSVILLE, OHIO, PRODUCTION FACILITY FROM 1987 TO 2000, AMMONIA EMISSIONS HAVE DECREASED 75%. OTHER PLANT IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE A NEW CAPTIVE WATER SYSTEM THAT COMPLETELY ELIMINATED ALL PROCESS AND SANITARY WATER DISCHARGE.

continually exploring new active control ingredients to benefit both the consumer and the environment. We're also making an ongoing effort to improve consumer education to help ensure that our products are used as intended.

Stewardship practices also have played a key role as we've modernized our manufacturing facilities. For example, we've taken steps to dramatically reduce emissions and incorporated a captive process and wastewater system at our manufacturing facilities in Marysville. The result is cleaner air and zero water discharge.





Scotts also enjoys strong relationships with regulatory agencies in the United States, Canada and Europe. At home in Ohio, we have worked with regulators to ensure the safety of landfills and waste water treatment facilities. In the United Kingdom, Scotts entered into a ground-breaking agreement with the English government and environmental groups to restore three peat bogs operated by the company to maintain a unique wildlife habitat.

Scotts has won praise for its environmental commitment. We are proud that our Corporate Environment Management Program has been certified to ISO 14001 standards, an international certification that evaluates a company's ability to apply sound environmental principles. In addition, the Ohio Chemistry Technology Council has selected The Scotts Company to receive The Ohio Chemistry Technology Council's 2001 Award for Excellence in Responsible Care. This award recognizes our achievements in Pollution Prevention worldwide.

Whatever the issue, Scotts is more dedicated than ever to improving the environment. After all, a more beautiful world is what our business is all about.

Recognized as an innovator in the lawn and garden industry. Scotts is working on a number of projects aimed at improving the environmental impact of its products. Using biotechnology we are developing grasses that allow weeds to be controlled with less toxic chemicals and others that may require less water and less-frequent mowing.
