

AIMS OF THIS SECTION

- To gain a basic understanding of what lobbyists and think tanks are and why understanding them can be useful for campaign research.
- To be introduced to some websites and tools that can help you find lobbyists.
- To learn how to find donations to political parties and financial interests of politicians.



WHAT ARE LOBBYISTS?

- Lobbying is when an individual or a group tries to persuade someone in parliament or influence the government to support a particular policy or campaign.
- Corporate lobbyists represent corporations or the economic interests of a particular group of capitalists.
- Lobbying is a huge industry but mostly operates behind closed doors.
- Lobbyists will be intimately connected to the media and be able to greatly influence certain narratives.
- Corporations will create an evidence base and lobby indirectly for their interests. For example, funding think tanks. This was a common tactic of the tobacco industry.



WHAT ARE LOBBYISTS?

- Industry bodies will keep people with oppositional views under great surveillance and strategically intervene with counter narratives.
- The lobbying area is a digital one not just face-to-face lunches with MPs.
- Relationships are power! There is a common revolving door between politicians and capitalist interests.

THINK TANKS

- A body of experts providing advice and ideas on specific political or economic problems.
- Most think tanks are non-governmental organisations, but some are semi-autonomous agencies within government or are associated with particular political parties or businesses.
- Mostly funded by capitalists (millionaires, industry bodies, companies) and some by grants.

- Understand the power relationships at play.
- Have foresight of what is on the horizon e.g. prison expansion.
- Be prepared for common narratives that need countering.





Some special interests retain lobbying firms, many of them located along Washington's legendary K Street; others have lobbyists working in-house.
