- 1. Saudi Aramco.** Aramco Overseas: 10 Portman Square, W1H 6AZ. Saudi national oil company, the world's biggest oil producer & greenhouse gas emitter.
- 2. Gazprom.** 20 Triton Street, NW1 3BF. Massive Russian gas company, the world's biggest natural gas producer.
- 3. National Iranian Oil Company.** NIOC House, 6th Floor, 4 Victoria Street, SW1H 0NE. Iran is the world's second biggest oil producer, after Saudi Arabia.
- 4. China National Petroleum Corporation (CNPC).** The Adelphi, 1-11 John Adam Street, WC2N 6HT. China's state oil company. China is the world's biggest carbon emitter.
- 5. Petróleos de Venezuela (PDVSA).** 7 Old Park Lane, W1K 1QR. Venezuelan state oil and gas company.
- 6. Sonatrach.** Sonatrach Gas Marketing: 5th floor, Pantom House, 25 Haymarket, SW1Y 4EN. National oil company of Algeria, the largest company in Africa.
- 7. BP.** Global HQ: 1 St James's Square, SW1Y 4PD. British oil giant with a bloody history of environmental devastation and colonial violence.
- 8. Shell.** Shell Centre, Belvedere Road, SE1 7NA. British-Dutch oil major with a long record of atrocities.
- 9. ConocoPhillips.** 20th floor, 1 Angel Court, EC2R 7JH. One of the three massive US oil majors.
- 10. Energean.** 3rd floor, Accurist House, 44 Baker Street, W1U 7AL. Greek-Israeli-UK oil and gas company turning the Mediterranean into an oil field.
- 11. Neptune Energy.** Nova North, 11 Bressenden Place, SW1E 5BY. British oil and gas “independent” drilling in the North Sea, North Africa and Asia.
- 12. Perenco.** 8 Hanover Square, W1S 1HQ. Anglo-French oil and gas company, accused of human rights violations in DR Congo.
- 13. UK Oil and Gas (UKOG).** The Broadgate Tower, 8th Floor, 20 Primrose Street, EC2A 2EW. Oil company active at Horse Hill and other English onshore sites.
- 14. TechnipFMC.** 1 St. Paul's Churchyard, EC4M 8AP. Oil and gas infrastructure from platforms to refineries, involved in big bribery scandals.
- 15. Teekay Shipping.** Thomas House, 4th Floor, 84 Eccleston Square, SW1V 1PX. One of the world's biggest shipping companies, specialising in oil and liquefied gas tankers.
- 16. Maran (MTM).** Manning House, 22 Carlisle Place, SW1P 1JA. One of the world's top ten tanker fleets, owned by Greece's largest shipping company, the Angelicoussis Group.
- 17. Interconnector (Fluxys and Snam).** 4th Floor, Burdett House, 15-16 Buckingham Street, WC2N 6DU. UK venture of two of Europe's biggest gas pipeline pushers.



NON-FOSSIL ENERGY

- 1. Electricité de France (EDF).** EDF Trading: 3rd Floor, Cardinal Place, 80 Victoria Street, SW1E 5JL. Europe's largest nuclear power generator, owns all UK nuclear reactors.
- 2. Vattenfall.** 1 Tudor St, EC4Y 0AH. Swedish state-owned energy company suing Germany for shutting down its nuclear plants.
- 3. E.ON.** E.ON Citigen CHP plant: 47-53 Charterhouse Street, EC1M 6PB. German energy company, owns nuclear plants and has pushed for new UK coal.
- 4. Statkraft.** 19th Floor, 22 Bishopsgate, EC2N 4BQ. Norwegian state multinational whose dam schemes in Chile are being resisted by Mapuche people.
- 5. Active Energy Group plc.** 27-28 Eastcastle Street, W1W 8DH. International biomass and deforestation business, cutting forests in North America



MINING

- 1. RWE.** 60 Threadneedle Street, EC2R 8HP. Western Europe's biggest coal burner and owner of major lignite mines. One mine has met strong resistance in Germany's Hambach forest.
- 2. Glencore.** 18 Hanover Square, London, W1S 1JY. The world's largest mining company by revenue, with a long toxic record.
- 3. Anglo American PLC.** 17 Charterhouse Street, EC1N 6RA. Digging devastation from South Africa to South America and co-owner of the Cerrejon coal mine in Colombia, site of a 91-day strike by workers in 2020.
- 4. BHP Group.** Nova South, 160 Victoria Street, SW1E 5LB. One of the world's largest miners, responsible for the devastating Samarco tailings dam collapse in Brazil.
- 5. Rio Tinto.** 6 St James's Square, SW1Y 4AD. Metals and mining multinational, polluting water and air from Mongolia to the USA. Recently blew up a 46,000-year-old sacred Aboriginal site in Australia's Juukan Gorge.
- 6. Vedanta Resources.** 30 Berkeley Square London, W1J 6EX.

- The Dongria Kondh people have been resisting its open-pit bauxite mine plans in Orissa, India, for over ten years.
- 7. ArcelorMittal Limited.** 7th Floor, Berkeley Square House, Berkeley Square, W1J 6DA. World's largest steel producer, has recently faced pollution trials in South Africa, Italy, Bosnia and Ukraine.
 - 8. Barrick Gold.** 1st Floor, 2 Savoy Court, Strand, WC2R 0EZ. Canadian gold miner known for cyanide spills and allegations of violent abuse.
 - 9. Antofagasta.** Cleveland House, 33 King Street, SW1Y 6RJ. British copper miner responsible for massive toxic waste dumping in Chile.
 - 10. GCM Resources.** 3 Bunhill Row, EC1Y 8YZ. Strong resistance has so far halted its planned Philbarri open-pit coal mine in Bangladesh.



INFRASTRUCTURE

- 1. Koch Industries.** Koch Supply and Trading: 4th Floor, 20 Gresham Street, EC2V 7JE. Empire of chemicals, cattle and more, owned by US billionaires funding right-wing propaganda.
- 2. Noble Group.** Office 6.01, Nova North, 11 Bressenden Place, SW1E 5BY. Hong Kong-based global commodities conglomerate.
- 3. Siemens.** Siemens Mobility: 7th Floor, Euston House, 24 Eversholt Street, NW1 1AD. Giant German industrial. Working on Adani Carmichael coal mine and many more schemes.
- 4. Vinci.** VINCI Concessions UK: 1 Eversholt Street, NW1 2DN. Eurovia UK (transport construction): 26 Store Street, WC1E 7BT, Taylor Woodrow (UK subsidiary): Euston Tower Level 33, 285 Euston Road, NW1A 3DP. French construction beast with projects worldwide, including the Adani coal mine in Australia.
- 5. Sir Robert McAlpine.** 4th Floor, 63 St Mary's Axe, EC3A 8AA. UK builder of dams, nuclear plants, and more. Started the industry's anti-union blacklist.
- 6. CRH (Tarmac).** Tarmac: Level 4, 40 Strand, WC2N 5RW. Global cement producer which has been embroiled in corruption allegations in Ireland and Poland.



AGRIBUSINESS

- 1. ABF (Associated British Foods).** Weston Centre, 10 Grosvenor Street, W1K 4QY. British food giant, one of world's biggest sugar empires. Also owns Primark.
- 2. Cargill.** 3rd Floor, 77 Queen Victoria Street, EC4V 4AY. US agri giant, its soya plantations are a major cause of Amazon deforestation.
- 3. Archer Daniels Midland (ADM).** ADM Investor Services: 3rd Floor, The Minster Building, 21 Mincing Lane, EC3R 7AG. US food conglomerate dealing in Amazon soya, palm oil and biofuels.
- 4. Olam International.** New Zealand House, 80 Haymarket, SW1Y 4TE. Singaporean cash crop empire, accused of landgrabs, forest razing, and human rights atrocities for palm oil and more.
- 5. Unilever.** 100 Victoria Embankment, EC4Y 0DY. Consumer giant, major users of forest-clearing palm oils and ocean-clogging plastics.
- 6. Tata Group.** 18 Grosvenor Place, SW1X 7HS. Massive Indian conglomerate, from coal mines and chemicals, to vast tea plantations.



BANKS

- 1. ICBC (Industrial and Commercial Bank of China).** 81 King William Street, EC4N 7BG. Chinatown Branch: 81-85 Shaftesbury Avenue, W1D 5DX. Biggest bank in the world. Funding Gilgel Gibe III in Ethiopia, “Africa's most destructive dam”.
- 2. China Construction Bank.** 11 Old Broad Street, EC2N 1AP. One of the world's biggest banks, and the second biggest financier of coal mining.
- 3. Goldman Sachs.** Plumtree Court, 25 Shoe Lane, EC4A 4AU. Extremely powerful global investment bank, funds Amazon deforestation and much more.
- 4. Bank of America.** 2 King Edward Street, EC1A 1HQ. US multinational bank, has funded Adani, RWE, Wilmar, and many others.

- 5. Deutsche Bank.** 1 Great Winchester Street, EC2N 2DB. Germany's biggest bank, major Third Reich profiteer, Russian Mafia money-launderer, and massive investor in coal mining.
- 6. Royal Bank of Canada.** RBC Europe Limited: 100 Bishopsgate, EC2N 4AA. Canada's top bank, second-biggest funder of tar sands exploitation.
- 7. Natwest.** 250 Bishopsgate, EC2M 4AA. Third biggest UK banking group. Now owns Royal Bank of Scotland, a major oil and gas funder.
- 8. European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD).** One Exchange Square, EC2A 2JN. HQ in London, focused on East European privatisations. Main backer of Balkans dam projects.
- 9. Halkbank.** Floor 1, 48 Dover Street, W1S 4FF. Turkish state-owned bank, one of the main funders of the Ilisu dam project.
- 10. Unicredit.** Moor House, 120 London Wall, EC2Y 5ET. Italian investment bank active across Europe, one of main funders of Balkan rivers dam projects.
- 11. RFC Ambrian.** Octagon Point, 5 Cheapside, EC2V 6AA. Boutique investment bank for metals and mining and oil and gas sectors.

- 6. Legal & General Investment Management.** 1 Coleman Street, EC2R 5AA. The biggest UK-based investment manager, around \$1.2 trillion AUM.
- 7. Prudential PLC.** 1 Angel Court, EC2R 7AG. UK insurer and fund manager, \$856 billion.
- 8. Norges Bank Investment Management.** Queensberry House, 3 Old Burlington Street, W1S 3AE. Runs Norway's massive oil reserve fund, with just under \$1.2 trillion assets.
- 9. Kuwait Investment Authority (KIA).** Wren House, 15 Carter Lane, EC4V 5EY. Kuwait's \$533 billion fund owns UK ports and North Sea oil infrastructure.
- 10. Temasek Holdings.** 23 King Street, SW1Y 6QY. Singaporean \$417bn fund, invests worldwide in oil, agribusiness, real estate, and more.

- 18. Sculptor Capital.** 2nd Floor, 40 Argyl Street, W1F 7EB. US billionaire Daniel Och's fund, accused of \$100 million bribes for resource deals in Africa.
- 19. Kerogen Capital.** 6th Floor, 50 Pall Mall, SW1Y 5JH. Oil and gas private equity fund. Has been a big investor in North Sea companies and Energean.
- 20. EIG Global Energy Partners.** 7th Floor, 20 St. James's Street, SW1A 1ES. Invests in oil and gas and “alternative energy”, including Bolivia pipeline and Canada tar sands.
- 21. Red Kite Capital.** 1 Bartholomew Lane, EC2N 2AX. Mining fund run by former Tory treasurer Lord Michael Farmer – called “Mr Copper”.
- 22. Orion Resource Partners.** 33 Welbeck St, W1G 8EX. Specialist fund, previously part of Red Kite, invests in mining companies including Dalradian.
- 23. Riverstone.** 3 St James's Square, SW1Y 4JU. Energy PE fund, investments include coal and UK fracking firm Cuadrilla.



- 5. London Metal Exchange (LME).** 10 Finsbury Square, EC2A 1AJ. The world's largest market for trading metals futures and options contracts.
- 6. ICE Futures Europe.** 5th Floor, Milton Gate, 60 Chiswell Street, EC1Y 4SA. Main European derivatives exchange, including bets on oil prices, and EU carbon allowances.



LAW FIRMS

- 1. Gibson Dunn & Crutcher.** Telephone House, 2-4 Temple Avenue, EC4Y 0HB. US multinational, prides itself on defending corporates accused of environmental atrocities.
- 2. Dentons.** 1 Fleet Place, EC4M 7RA. Has 10,000 lawyers globally. An (anti-)“aboriginal law” team supports corporate incursions.
- 3. Latham & Watkins.** 99 Bishopsgate, EC2M 3XF. US firm, clients include Exxon Mobil, Chevron and defending Shell against Niger Delta lawsuits.
- 4. Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer.** 100 Bishopsgate, EC2P 2SR. UK corporate law firm, advises multinationals fighting environmental and human rights claims.
- 5. Allen & Overy.** 1 Bishop's Square, E1 6AD. Big UK firm, worked on the Trans Adriatic Gas Pipeline (“TAP”) and other pipeline cases.
- 6. Norton Rose Fulbright.** 3 More London Riverside, SE1 2AQ. Defends multinationals against “toxic tort” cases including “mass disaster and catastrophic events”.



MILITARY & SECURITY

- 1. BAE Systems.** 4th Floor, Blue Fin Building, 110 Southwark Street, SE1 0TA. UK arms company and Europe's largest. Major arms supplier to Saudi Arabia.
- 2. Leonardo.** 1 Eagle Place, SW1Y 6AF. Italian arms company producing helicopters, drones, missiles, and the rest. FKA Finmeccanica. Europe's second-largest arms producer.
- 3. G4S.** 46 Gillingham Street, London, SW1V 1HU. British security giant that offers everything from prisons to mercenary armies.
- 4. Control Risks.** Cottons Centre, Cottons Lane, SE1 2QG. Mercenary company, has secured oil assets in Iraq, and played an active role in Libya.
- 5. Mifite.** The Shard, Level 12, 32 London Bridge Street, SE1 9SG. Also: Cottons Centre, Cottons Lane, SE1 2QG. UK outsourcing, and the UK's biggest security company by turnover. Runs migrant detention centres and private sector guarding.



PROPAGANDISTS

- 1. News UK.** 1 London Bridge Street, SE1 9GF. UK division of Rupert Murdoch's global right-wing media empire.
- 2. Confederation of British Industry.** Cannon Place, 78 Cannon Street, EC4N 6HN. “The voice for business”.
- 3. Institute of Directors.** 116 Pall Mall, SW1Y 5ED. Membership organisation for company bosses established 1903.
- 4. The CityUK.** Fitzwilliam House, 10 St Mary Axe, EC3A 8BF. “Britain's most powerful financial lobby group”.
- 5. The Geological Society.** Burlington House, Piccadilly, W1J 0BG. Huge membership organisation of geologists, and major promoters of fossil fuels.
- 6. Oil and Gas UK (OGUK).** 1st Floor, Paternoster House, 65 St Paul's Churchyard, EC4M 8AB. Upstream oil and gas association, 400 members from Shell and BP to auditors like Deloitte.
- 7. World Coal Association (WCA).** 5th Floor, Heddon House, 149-151 Regent Street, W1B 4JD. Members include Glencore and other mining giants.
- 8. International Council of Mining and Metals (ICMM).** 35/38 Portman Square, W1H 6LR. Members are 28 mining giants: BHP, Glencore, RioTinto, etc.
- 9. Carbon Capture and Storage Association (CCSA).** 6th Floor, 10 Dean Farrar Street, SW1H 0DX. Members include BP, Shell, Total, Wood and others on the map.
- 10. Global Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) Institute.** Evergreen House North, Grafton Place, NW1 2DX.
- 11. Climate Markets and Investment Association (CMIA)** 100 New Bridge Street, EC4V 6JA.

CANARY WHARF

This map covers central London. There is another cluster of ecocidal capital further East in the private business district of Canary Wharf. Earth wreckers with HQs over in E14 include:

Banks: JP Morgan, the world's top fossil fuel bank. HSBC: the biggest UK bank, fracking funder and drug cartel money launderer. Also: Citigroup, Barclays, Morgan Stanley, Credit Suisse, and more.

Oil companies: two of the “supermajors”, Chevron and Total. Global oil field contractor Wood PLC. Also: investment managers State Street. Auditors KPMG. The credit rating agencies: Moody's, Standard & Poors, and Fitch. And migrant-scapegoating, climate-change-denying rag, the Daily Express.

- 18. Edelman UK.** Southside, 105 Victoria St, SW1E 6QT. US PR giant, have been big fracking promoters, worked for TransCanada pipeline and many oil companies. ** (NB: Edelman shares this building with G4S and the NHS).
- 19. Lexington Communications.** The Connection, 198 High Holborn, WC1V 7BD. Provided PR for the fracking and GM food industries.
- 20. Newgate communications.** Sky Light City Tower, 50 Basinghall Street, EC2V 5DE. Energy PR specialist, described by Spinwatch as a “longstanding fracking industry lobbyist”.

The top investors in this list all own shares in numerous companies on the map.

- 1. BlackRock.** 12 Throgmorton Avenue, Drapers Gardens, EC2N 2DL. The world's biggest investment manager, manages over \$9 trillion dollars worth of assets.
- 2. Vanguard Group.** 25 Walbrook, EC4N 8AF. Second biggest global investor, \$7 trillion. “Index” investor buying shares in all listed companies.
- 3. Fidelity.** 4 Cannon Street, EC4M 5AB. Major US-based global investment manager, \$4 trillion assets under management (AUM).
- 4. Capital Group.** 40 Grosvenor Place, SW1X 7GG. US fund manager with \$2.3 trillion AUM.
- 5. Amundi (Credit Agricole).** 77 Coleman Street, EC2R 5BJ. French fund manager, part of Credit Agricole bank. Approx \$1.8 trillion AUM.

- 14. KKR (Kohlberg Kravis Roberts).** 18 Hanover Square, London, W1S 1JY. Notorious asset-stripping US PE fund. Backing the Coastal GasLink pipeline in Canada being resisted by the Wet'suwet'en.
- 15. CVC Capital Partners.** 111 Strand, WC2R 0AG. Biggest UK-based PE fund. Investments include Neptune Oil and the UK's biggest oil pipeline.
- 16. Man Group PLC.** Riverbank House, 2 Swan Lane, EC4R 3AD. Biggest UK hedge fund, sponsored the Man Booker prize and gambles on “natural catastrophe bonds”.
- 17. Autonomy Capital.** Floor 34, 110 Bishopsgate, EC2N 4AY. US-based hedge fund reported to be a big gambler on European carbon emissions.



OTHER FINANCE

The “Big Four” auditors sign off the accounts of most major corporations. They are embroiled in allegations of cartelling, fraud and money-laundering. (NB: the fourth one, KPMG, is based in Canary Wharf.)
